Beautiful, hand-painted ceramic necklaces link Oklahoma City to Nairobi, Kenya, in a project sponsored by the Project Woman Coalition.

Project Woman exists to provide low-income Oklahoma women with breast health awareness and access to breast cancer screening, diagnostic services and treatment.

To raise money for these services, Project Woman is selling Kazuri jewelry made by women in Nairobi. Founded by Lady Susan Wood in 1975, Kazuri now employs more than 120 Kenyan women, most single moms, with a livable wage.
